## The Doctrine of God's Sovereignty (continued)

And when the Gentiles heard this, they began rejoicing and glorifying the word of the Lord, and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed. (Acts 13:48)

Ephesians 1:3-12 Romans 9:10-24 Job 38

## The Doctrine of God's Omnipotence

Our God is in the heavens; he does all that he pleases. (Psalm 115:3)

Ah, Lord GOD! It is you who have made the heavens and the earth by your great power and by your outstretched arm! Nothing is too hard for you. (Jeremiah 32:17)

Psalm 33:10-12

Creation (Genesis 1) and Resurrection (1 Corinthians 15)

Exodus 6:3-9

Notice v. 9: "Moses spoke thus to the people of Israel, but they did not listen to Moses, because of their broken spirit and harsh slavery."

Notice 2 factors that made it hard for them to trust/have hope in God's power.

1) Their <u>situation</u>, and 2) their <u>hearts</u>.

What are twin dangers of not applying our trust in God's almighty power to real life?

1) We might <u>avoid</u> dealing with things that seem too big, outside our complete control... Or we might 2) <u>try</u> to do things that are not within our power to do.

Encouragement from Ephesians 1:18-23

The worldview rival to God's Omnipotence = **Scientific naturalism.** (Everything has a natural explanation, without any involvement from a higher, outside power.)

Remember John Lennon's famous song, "Imagine."

Imagine there's no heaven

It's easy if you try

No hell below us

Above us, only sky

"Because children have abounding vitality, because they are in spirit fierce and free, therefore they want things repeated and unchanged. They always say, 'Do it again'; and the grown-up person does it again until he is nearly dead. For grown-up people are not strong enough to exult in monotony. But perhaps God is strong enough to exult in monotony. It is possible that God says every morning, 'Do it again' to the sun; and every evening, 'Do it again' to the moon. It may not be automatic necessity that makes all daisies alike; it may be that God makes every daisy separately, but has never got tired of making them. It may be that He has the eternal appetite of infancy; for we have sinned and grown old, and our Father is younger than we." G.K. Chesterton, *Orthodoxy*
